
Contributions to local and global communities



International exchange agreements


We actively promote exchanges with top global universities as a university leading globalization of the region.



The University Library is composed of the Central Library, the Medical Library and the Pharmacy Library. Approximately 510,000 visitors and rental of 63,000 books in a year.




