Notes:

*"Number of applicants for admission" column indicates the number of applicants by category who have submitted application forms according to the application guidelines.

*"Number of students enrolled" refers to those who enrolled as of May 1 (including substitutes but excluding transfers). Therefore, those who once enrolled but withdrew or were expelled from the university by May 1 are excluded.

*"From Kumamoto University" refers to those who graduated from undergraduate course of Kumamoto University in case of Master's course or Integrated Doctoral Course. In case of Doctoral Course, it refers those completed of graduated from Master's course of Kumamoto University

*"From foreign schools" column refers to those who have completed 16 years of school education (or 18 years of school education for those who enter the Doctoral Course in medical, dental, or pharmaceutical sciences (of a graduate school founded on a six year undergraduate program), or veterinary science) in a foreign country, as prescribed in Article 155, paragraph 1, item 3 of the Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Education Act.

*"Others" column indicates the number of students stipulated in Article 155, paragraph 1, item 1, 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8 of the Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Education Act.

*If Students have been admitted to the major of their second choice because of the results of the entrance examination, they are included in the number of applicants for entrance and new students to the major of their second choice.
