1 Medicinal Plant Garden



With the purpose of education and research through medicinal plants, about 10,000 kinds of herbal plant are cultivated on a 7,000m² which include the Medicinal Plant Garden and the Tree Garden. A tour of the garden and various seminars such as "Basic Chinese herbs" are held regularly. Opens from 9:00 to 17:00 on weekdays. Free admission.

2 Banjikan Hall



The hall includes a co-op restaurant, a shop, and a seminar room for special lectures. The restaurant opens from 11:30 to 13:30 and the shop and the bookstore are open from 9:30 to 18:30 on weekdays only.

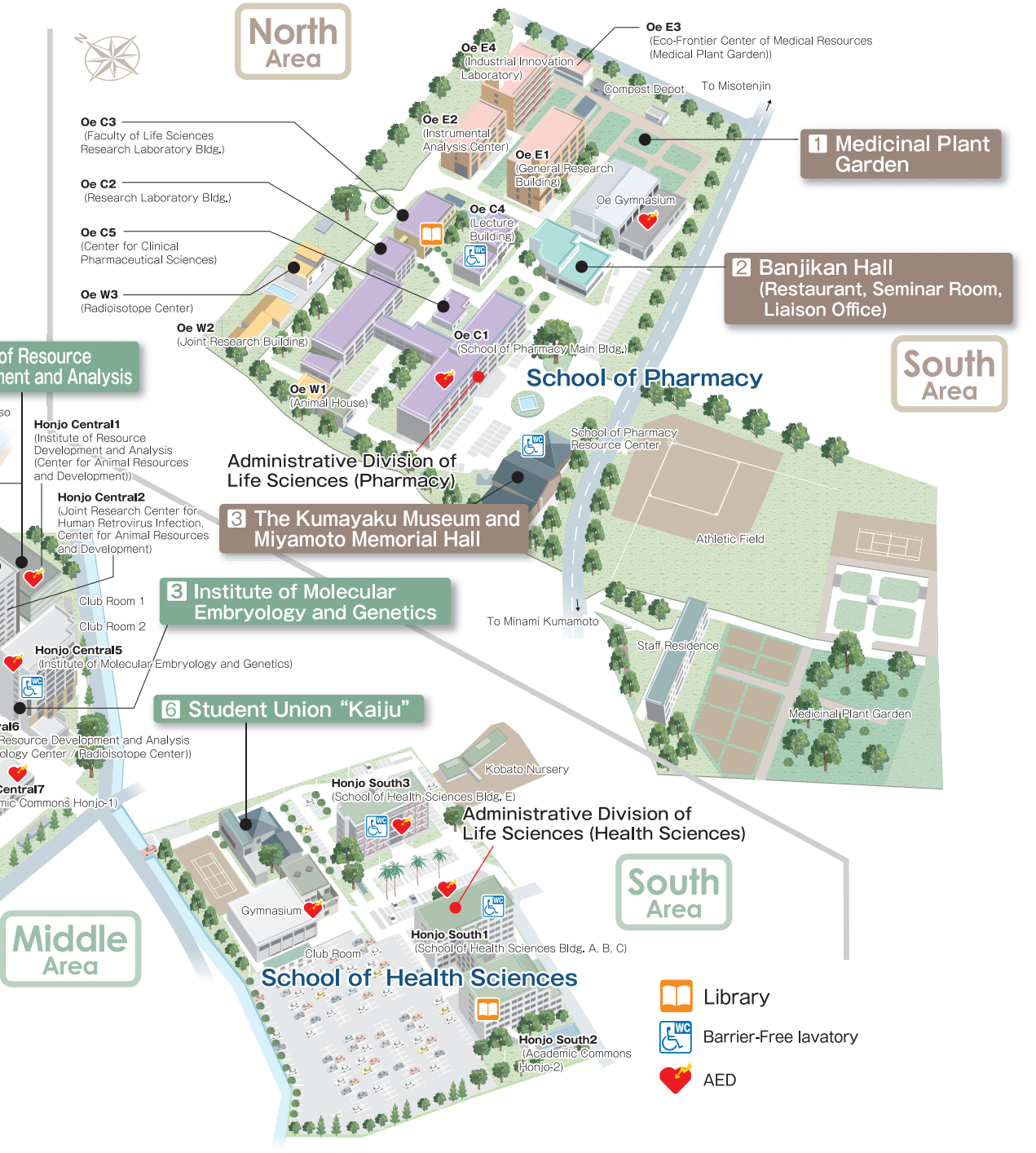
3 Kumayaku Museum and Miyamoto Memorial Hall



The Kumayaku Museum in the alumni house features the exhibition of century-old invaluable documents on the tradition of the School of Pharmacy and its rare experimental instruments. The Miyamoto Memorial Hall was founded through a donation by Yoshihiro Miyamoto, who was a former student of Kumamoto Pharmaceutical Academy, the predecessor of the School of Pharmacy. The hall serves as a forum for education and research.

1 Yamasaki Memorial Hall

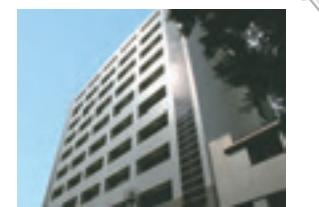


Kumamoto University Hospital
As the only university hospital in Kumamoto prefecture, it contributes to the region by providing highly advanced medical technology and nurturing medical physicians. The hospital has 845 beds and over 1,500 out-patients a day, and is also certified as a center of collaboration for cancer treatment in Kumamoto prefecture.

Commemorating the achievements of Dr. Masatada Yamasaki, the father of the restoration of the School of Medicine, the hall was completed in 1931. The hall was moved 48m away from its original location, when the new Clinic Center Building was constructed in 2006.

2 Joint Research Center for Human Retrovirus Infection



Since merging on April 1, 2019, Center for AIDS Research in Kumamoto University and Center for Chronic Viral Diseases in Kagoshima University have integrated to create the Joint Research Center for Human Retrovirus Infection.

3 Institute of Molecular Embryology and Genetics



The institute studies developmental processes from an egg to an entire body, and promotes integration of developmental biology and medical sciences. Our achievements are applicable to various areas including treatment of diseases and organ regeneration. The institute is selected by the government as one of the Joint Research Centers in Japan.

4 International Research Center for Medical Sciences (IRCMS)



IRCMS has a strong interest with the highest priority in developing a global collaboration. At this time fundamental research in the areas of Hematology, Vascular Biology, Cancer and Retrovirology has begun, with plans to expand into basic and translational biology and medicine.

2 Joint Research Center for Human Retrovirus Infection



This institute was established for the purpose of promoting comprehensive education and research in various scientific areas by providing diverse research resources and information. It consists of the reorganized Center for Animal Resources and Development, Gene Technology Center, Radioisotope Center, three RI centers and Instrumental Analysis Center. They conduct research in the university, in Japan and other countries to provide the support of life science research and supply of research resources.

5 Institute of Resource Development and Analysis



The restaurant on the 1st floor opens from 11:30 to 14:00. The shop and bookstore on the 2nd floor open from 10:00 to 18:00 on weekdays only.

By Detetsu-Bus : Take a bus for Hikarinomori, Kusunoki or Musashigaoka and get off at "Kumamoto Daigakumae".

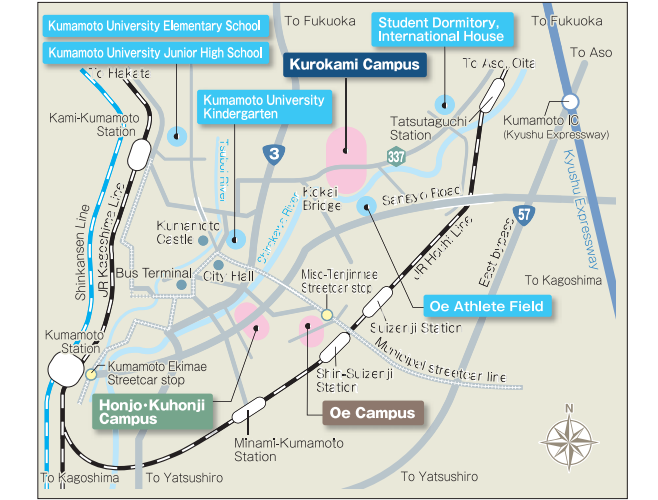
From JR Kami-Kumamoto Station

From JR Tatsutaguchi Station (JR Houhi Line)
By Sanko - Bus : Take a bus for Kohitsu-Center (Bus Terminal) and get off at "Kumamoto Daigakumae".

From JR Kumamoto Station
By Kumamoto-Toshi Bus : Take a bus on the 1st loop line (via Daigaku Byojinmae and Otoroku) and get off at "Daigaku Byojinmae".
By Sanko - Bus : Take a bus for Kiyama or Nuyamazu (via Kengun and Kencho), or for Kenkaigijido, and take off at "Misotenjin". 5 minutes walk.
By Kumamoto Bus : Take a bus for Mifune, Kousa or Jyonan (via Kengun and Kencho) and get off at "Misotenjin". 5 minutes walk.

From Bus Terminal
By Kumamoto-Toshi Bus : Take a bus for Omine or Nisseki, and get off at "Misotenjin". 5 minutes walk.
By Sanko - Bus : Take a bus for Kiyama or Nuyamazu (via Kengun and Kencho), or for Kenkaigijido, and take off at "Misotenjin". 5 minutes walk.
By Kumamoto Bus : Take a bus for Mifune, Kousa or Jyonan (via Kengun and Kencho) and get off at "Misotenjin". 5 minutes walk.

1 The Red Gate



The gate has been well known as "the Red Gate" since it was relocated as the main gate of the Fifth High School in 1889.

2 The Memorial Museum of the Fifth High School



The red brick building was completed in 1889 as the main building for the Fifth High School, where Lafcadio Hearn and Natsume Soseki gave lectures. The museum offers historical data about higher education since the Meiji Era to the general public. Free admission. Open from 10:00 to 16:00 except Tuesdays.

3 The Chemical Laboratory of the Fifth High School



Like the main building, this red brick building was also completed in 1889. It includes a lecture hall and the oldest draft chamber (fume hood) in Japan.

4 Student Hall Cafeteria



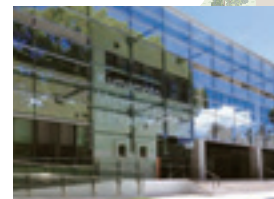

Books, stationery, convenience goods, tickets and the university original products are sold at the shop. Opens from 8:10 to 19:00 on weekdays.

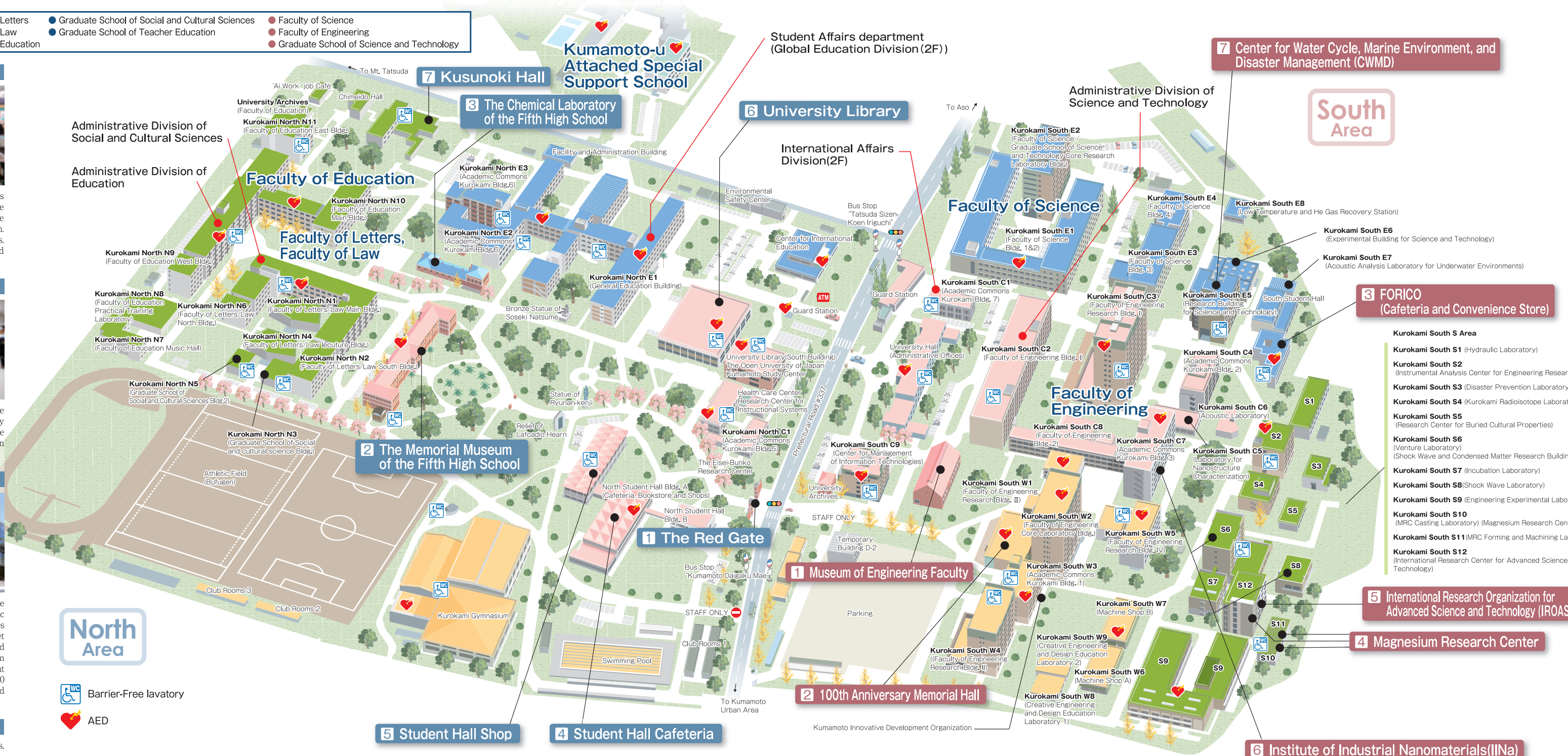
6 University Library



The university library is open to the public and provides vast academic information to community. Services include booklending and internet access to the library's books and collection inventory. Opens from 8:40 to 22:00 on weekdays (Closes at 17:00 during school holidays), 12:00 to 18:00 on Saturdays, Sundays and national holidays.

1 Museum of Engineering Faculty



The building was completed in 1908 as a machine experimental factory of Kumamoto Junior College of Technology. The red-brick building and machine tools were designated as a Nationally Important Cultural Property. Also these are certified as "Machine Heritage" by the Japan Society of Mechanical Engineers. The building is opened to the public every third Friday from 13:00 to 16:00.

2 100th Anniversary Memorial Hall



In commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the Faculty of Engineering, the hall was completed in 2004 with donations from alumni, faculty-related people and corporations. Events such as lectures and concerts are held in the hall.

3 FORICO (Cafeteria and Store)



The nickname "FORICO" was coined by a student, meaning "for students of Faculties of Science and Engineering". Shop & Bakery opens from 9:30 to 20:00 and Cafe & Restaurant opens from 10:00 to 20:00 on weekdays.

4 Magnesium Research Center

The center has been extensively involved in a variety of magnesium-related research area since its establishment in December, 2011. These include alloy design, casting metal formation, mechanical properties, corrosion surface treatment, and recycling.

5 International Research Organization for Advanced Science and Technology (IROAST)

IROAST was established to promote the international joint research works on the frontier of material sciences. IROAST has also a significant role to enlarge the international research networks for advanced material sciences among overseas universities and institutions.

6 Institute of Industrial Nanomaterials(IINa)

The mission of the institute is to promote researches bringing into new industrial applications, such as 2-dimensional nano-sheet and others, through various interdisciplinary approaches based on nanomaterials and materials informatics as a world leading research organization in the related field.

7 Center for Water Cycle, Marine Environment, and Disaster Management (CWMD)

CWMD consists of four laboratories namely: Water Resource Research Laboratory; Marine Science Laboratory; Disaster Mitigation Laboratory and Urban and Regional Design Laboratory. This center leads research and education in the area of groundwater resources in Kumamoto, marine environment around the Ariake Sea and the Yatsushiro Sea, disaster mitigation, and community design and participation.
